DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

1. In the following Definitions of Classes, First Prize wins in Limited Show Obedience Classes and Open Shows confined to one breed do not count for entry in Open and Championship Obedience Classes.
2. A dog must be entered in the lowest scheduled class for which it is eligible and may also be entered in another class if desired, one special class excepted.
3. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. Monday 29th JUNE 2010.

PRE-BEGINNERS ó To compete in Pre-Beginners a handler or dog must not have won a First Prize in Pre-beginners nor gained a Third place or above in any other Obedience Class.

BEGINNERS ó To compete in Beginners a handler or dog must not have won a total of two or more First Prizes in Beginners Class, or one First Prize in any other Obedience Class.
(Pre-beginner excepted)

NOVICE ó For dogs that have not won two First Prizes in Obedience Classes (Pre-beginners and Beginners excepted).

CLASS A ó For dogs which have not won three First Prizes in Class A, B and Open Class C in total.

CLASS B ó For dogs which have not won three First Prizes in Class B and Open Class C in total.

OPEN CLASS C ó Open to all dogs.

1 Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Obedience Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B.

2. (a) The Show will open at 9.30 am. (b) Judging will commence at 10.00 am.
3. Dogs will be received until 11.00 am. after which no dogs may be received except under unforeseen and exceptional circumstances and by special permission of the Show Management.
4. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. ENTRY FEE - £4.50 PER DOG PER CLASS NFC Free
6. PRIZE MONEY 1st £12.00: 2nd £8.00: 3rd £4.00: 4th £2.00
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry in the Show can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the competitor.
9. Animals Allowed in Show. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of a dog show during its continuance except any dog registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.
10. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Obedience Shows.
11. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is strictly forbidden.
12. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
13. A dog shall be disqualified and removed from the Show if it is:- (a) A bitch which is in season (b) Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease (c) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent (d) Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal (e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
14. After a dog has commenced competing in a class, no substitute of handler is permitted in that class.
15. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
16. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge, the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
17. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
18. Should circumstances so dictate, the Society, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
19. The maximum number of entries allowed in any class is 60. If the entry received exceeds 60, the class shall be equally divided (to within one dog) by a draw. If the resulting class entry, after division, exceeds 60 a further division of the total class entry shall take place so that each equal division of the class is 60 or less. In all classes, other than Championship Class C, if the entry received exceeds 50 the class may, at the discretion of the Society, be equally divided by a draw (to within one dog). If the resulting individual class entry, after division, exceeds 50 a further division of the total entry may take place so that each equal division of the class is 50 or less. Prize money for each division (which must be judged separately) shall be the same as that offered for the original class.
20. Where classes are divided, competitors entered therein shall be notified of all changes and timed stay exercises must not be held earlier than advertised for the original class.
21. Where timed stays will take place it must be announced in the Schedule that they will take priority over other tests. The times of such tests to be published at the Show and in the Catalogue. Timed stays must not commence before one hour after the published time for the commencement of judging.
22. For the duration of the Show, and including those in the exercise area, all dogs must be on a lead except when competing or practising prior to competition.
23. Ballot for Running orders (I) Where a draw for the complete running order of classes is not made, Show management must conduct a ballot to determine a running order for at least the first ten competitors/dogs in these classes; this may be reduced to six at Shows with less than 200 dogs entered or where there are less than 25 dogs entered in a specific class.(ii) in classes where a complete or partial running order has been made, the relevant competitors must be notified before the date of the Show (iii) In classes where there is not a full running order all competitors must personally report to the ringside of all classes entered and book in, by marking a list of entries, within one hour of the scheduled time for the commencement of judging of the class.
In classes where a full running order has been made competitors must book in on arrival at the Show.
The class lists are to be provided by the Show Management and should be available from the stated opening time of the Show. Wherever possible Ring Stewards will be appointed to assist with

this booking in procedure. (iv) All published running orders must be strictly observed.

Competitors reporting late will be excluded from competition unless they have previously reported to the Chief Steward that they are actually working a dog in Championship Class C or in the stay test of another class.

24. No dog shall be allowed in the judging ring other than those in the class being judged
25. Nothing can be carried, worn or displayed by a handler or a dog during judging which is capable of indicating the identity of the dog or owner nor must anything be said or any action taken which identifies the dog other than by exhibit number.
26. Any dog that is not presented for stays or scent exercises when called for testing will be considered to have withdrawn from the class.
27. Food shall not be carried or given to a dog under test.
28. All offers of sponsorship or donation must be included with the names of the sponsors.
29. After the commencement of judging the responsibility for dogs being brought to the ring to compete is entirely the competitors.
30. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
31. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
32. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their full details recorded on the entry form.
33. Remedial action will be taken in the event of dogs left in vehicles and found to be in distress.
34. Dogs entered at the Show will be entirely at owners risk and whilst every care will be taken the Committee will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury caused whilst at the Show.
35. Entry is by entry form which must include a box for the Kennel Club Registration Number or Authority to Compete (ATC) number and the standard declaration approved By the Kennel Club and included in the specimen form issued by the Kennel Club.
36. In all classes the handler may use the dog's name with a command or signal without penalty. All tests shall commence and finish with the dog sitting at the handler's left side except in stay tests, distance control and Beginners, Novice or Test A recall tests when the dog may be left in either the sit or down position at the handler's discretion.
37. Dogs may only wear a slip chain or soft collar when in the ring.
